fellowships.




The champions commenced their sensitizations in April 2025 by visiting churches, holding awareness sessions and meetings with church leaders.

These step-down trainings have provided a vital opportunity for grassroots engagement within faith communities, equipping church members with knowledge about the dangers of GBV, strategies for prevention, and the role of religious institutions in creating safer and more inclusive environments.
